




HEON PROGRESSION FRAMEWORK





















It is developed from HEON's theory of change logic model, which states that to impact the **behaviour** (increased progression to higher education), first **knowledge** must be increased, which changes **attitudes**, or aspirations, towards higher education.



The framework is divided into three stages that relate to learners' current level of knowledge and aspirations towards higher education, and potential pathways, rather than specific year groups. Underpinning the framework are eight knowledge and six attitude **outcomes**.

PROGRESSION FRAMEWORK DEVELOPMENT

Ensuring opportunities for sustained and progressive activities

Our Progression Framework provides the opportunity for learners to progress through the three stages acquiring the knowledge and confidence through different activities and in different ways that accommodates different aspirations and pathways. Below are examples of two possible journeys that a learner might take:

EXAMPLE JOURNEY 1* – DEGREE ROUTE

INTRODUCTION TO **HIGHER EDUCATION STAGE1 – INTRODUCE & INSPIRE** (KO7, KO8, AO1)

This is a fantastic introduction to higher education for students who are early on in their decision-making process. The workshop will give students the opportunity to gain an insight into life within HE and an understanding of what to expect from HE. Discussions based around; what higher education is, experiencing subject tasters and engaging in a campus tour are all key aspects of this workshop.

SPRING RESIDENTIAL STAGE 2 – DEVELOP & DECIDE (KO1, KO5, KO7, KO8, AO1, AO2, AO3, AO4)

This part of the student's journey will take them on a HEON Spring Residential. The residential consists of workshops, practical activities and information sessions during the day to showcase all Higher Education options and possible career routes. Student also get the opportunity to engage in informal entertainment during the evening. Attendees will also get to meet current University students to really get a taste of what life at University would be like. Sessions are delivered by many of our partner institutions, which provides a varied, balanced insight into higher education options.

TRANSITION INTO HIGHER EDUCATION STAGE 3 – PREPARE & PROGRESS (KO7,KO8, AO1, AO4)

This part of the student's journey will delve into the transition from school/further education into higher education. The students will get an opportunity to look at topics ranging from; 'An Introduction into Higher Education' to 'Transition into University - How do you prepare?'. This session is a great opportunity for students to gain a real insight into what higher education life looks like and whether it could be the right fit for them.

INTRODUCTION TO APPRENTICESHIPS STAGE 1 – INTRODUCE & INSPIRE (KO1, KO2, KO7, AO2, AO6)

The starting point of this journey begins with an introduction and insight into Apprenticeships. This workshop will give the student an insight and understanding of higher & degree apprenticeships. They will be given the opportunity to compare apprenticeships with university degrees and given a greater understanding of the benefits of both.



HOW TO MAKE YOURSELF EMPLOYABLE **STAGE 1 – INTRODUCE & INSPIRE STAGE 2 – DEVELOP & DECIDE** (KO1, KO2, KO7, AO2, AO6)

This is a progressive set of workshops which provides the student with a step by step process to help them build their CV and practice completing applications. The programme will be delivered across 4 sessions and will give the students the skills to navigate they way through the work place and applying for roles, all of which are beneficial when considering an apprenticeship.



STEPPING ONTO YOUR CAREER LADDER **STAGE 3 – PREPARE & PROGRESS** (KO1, KO7, AO1, AO2, AO6)

This last step will enable students to identify a number of career paths using Start Profile. Students will be encouraged to work their way through a series of activities to understand more about themselves and their career options. Each session will support the students to complete the different tasks on Start Profile and provide opportunities for discussion and advice. This programme is made up of 6 progressive sessions.
